
# Food Code Exemptions




# Meat: Farm Gate and Custom Slaughter

Alaska farmers can sell their livestock through farm gate sales and butcher the meat for the new owner.

### **Poultry**

Alaska poultry producers can slaughter and process up to 20,000 birds each year on their premises.






### **Cottage Food**

Home producers in Alaska can sell up to \$25,000 worth of non-potentially hazardous foods each year.

### **Eggs**

Egg producers in Alaska can sell eggs to markets and food services if the eggs are clean, intact, and labeled.







### **Dairy**

Registered dairy producers in Alaska can sell their dairy products to markets and directly to consumers.

### And much more...

Other food code exemptions in Alaska include bake sales, raw honey, rabbits, donations, glacier ice, novelties, raw agricultural products, herd shares, reindeer meat, and more.
